

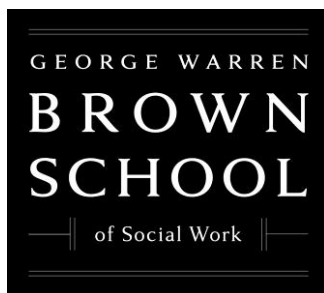
## Social Work/Public Health Post-Doctoral Opportunity

The **Social Work Training in Addictions Research (STAR) Program** at the George Warren Brown School of Social Work, Washington University in St. Louis, is seeking applicants for its post-doctoral fellowship. This is a 2-year program funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) designed to produce social work researchers who have state-of-the-art knowledge of addictions research, including alcohol, licit/illicit drug use, and tobacco. Applicants should be highly motivated, have recently obtained a doctorate in social work, public health or a related discipline, and must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Women and underrepresented populations are strongly encouraged to apply.

### Trainees will:

- Develop skills in research project development
- Participate in interdisciplinary curricula in such fields as Social Work, Public Health, Psychiatry, and/or Economics
- Work with expert mentors and consultants from the national Scientific Advisory Board
- Attend national substance abuse, social work, tobacco control and other public health conferences as learners and presenters
- Author and co-author scholarly publications
- Aid in the preparation of grant proposals
- Prepare and submit own research proposals (R01 or K01 level)
- Receive salary, tuition, travel expenses, and pilot research funds
